Kingmaker House - Public Consultation Event

The owners of Kingmaker House on the corner of Station Road & Lyonsdown Road are holding a public consultation to display their plans for this seven storey office building.

According to their publicity:

“The building already has planning permission to be converted to flats. The owners are now working on a plan to renovate the building and improve this prominent corner. The proposals include a new café, artisan studios, office space and new homes whilst updating and drastically improving the appearance of building and street scene.”

The consultation event is taking place on **Thursday 11 May** from 12 to 8 pm, at 3rd Floor, Kingmaker House, Station Road, New Barnet, EN5 1NZ.
